# **Mason Clinic-Pediatrics supports child literacy** through Reach Out and Read

Since 2003, Mason Clinic has participated in the nationwide **Reach Out and Read** program. At each well-child checkup for children from infancy through age 5, Mason Clinic pediatricians offer advice to caregivers about early relationships and literacy and give children a new book to take home to build their home libraries.

In 2024, Mason Clinic-Pediatrics provided 1,113 books to families at well-child visits, for a total of 39,524 books since 2003.

Reach Out and Read is an evidence-based program proven to show results for children and families and improve the quality of health care, with more than 20 studies demonstrating impact, scale, reach, and effectiveness. Findings show that when families receive Reach Out and Read, parents are two and a half times more likely to read to their children, and children's language development is improved by three to six months.

Research also links Reach Out and Read to improvements in children's social-emotional development and decreases in parental stress.
