

Vaccines and Flu Reminders

Mason County Public Health has declared that we are in flu season based on the increase of flu in the community.

To ensure the safety and health of the workforce, patients and visitors, any employee, provider or volunteer who has not received the 2024/2025 flu vaccine will need to wear a medical-grade mask in



all areas. Masks may be removed during meals and breaks to allow volunteers to eat and drink without hindrance.
